
If you are interested in any of the three territories, wish to join a team, or would like to do a feeder watch, please let me know.

Holiday gift idea, for game lovers...

Are you looking for a fun gift for a loved one this holiday season? Consider the game "**Wingspan**". Bird lovers love it, and guess what, so do those not enamored with birds. In fact, it was the game of the year in 2019 and has racked up numerous awards since.

A little about the game:

Each player (ornithologist, researcher, collector, general bird enthusiast) has an aviary and the goal is to attract birds to their aviary. The aviary has 3 different habitats; forest, meadow and wetlands. The game has 170 cards, each with a different species of bird. The cards indicate what the bird eats, where it lives, the type of nest it uses and the quantity of eggs it lays. Each card contains an interesting fact about the bird. Adding birds to your aviary, placing eggs atop a bird and meeting the requirements of bonus cards are rewarded with points. While there are multiple ways to earn points, the true winner is never revealed until the points have been added at the end of play.

Players learn about birds and their habits whether they intend to or not. For example, when the cowbird card is activated, the other players with a certain nest type get a free egg... because cowbirds lay their eggs in other birds' nests! Some cards when activated, like the chickadee, cache food atop their card ... because chickadees store (cache) food for the long winter. Each card reflects the characteristics of the actual birds they portray through their abilities, habitat, nesting place, wingspan... The birds were well researched and the cards are accurate.

Wingspan is made with beautiful artwork and high quality components. It is a game for 1 to 5 players, ages 10 & up. (Yes, they have a solo mode - I haven't tried that yet) The game's popularity prompted the creator to make a European and an Oceanic expansion pack. A digital version is in the making.

I received this game as a gift last Christmas and thought, great, now who will play a "bird game" with me? Since my kids gave it to me, they were obligated, my husband joined in. I read the directions and watched a YouTube video that demonstrated how to play (I highly recommend the video). We muddled through the first game, all first time players, and ended with a smile. To my surprise, they wanted to play again and yet again. The game never plays out the same twice. You can strategize, but the quantity of food and eggs may derail your efforts.

Since that first game, I've taught multiple people, old and young; they always want to play again. You can't play this game without appreciating the research and thoughtful creativity that went into its creation. There is something addictive about it. You are making decisions from the very first turn with complete control of your own aviary. With any luck, an expansion pack will be nestled under my Christmas tree. If anyone gets this game and would like me to teach you how to play, I would be happy to oblige.
